

## How to Dispose Of LATEX PAINT



1) Latex Paint is NOT a hazardous waste.

- 2) Donate useable paint to: Mountain Country Homes of Hope in Hollister Mo.
  - a. Homes of Hope will take your reusable paint if it is a ½ gallon or more.
  - b. Behind Hollister Police Station, 1 Gage Drive, Hollister (417) 335-2015
- 3) For unusable latex paint, thicken it to a solid:
  - a. Add cat litter, paint hardener or saw dust, or just leave the lid off and air dry.
- 4) Allow the paint to dry several days.
  - a. This prevents it from spilling out from the trash truck.
  - b. Half cans of latex paint will dry in approximately 5 days.
  - c. Adding kitty litter will help them dry in approximately 2 days.
- 5) Once the latex paint is dried into a semi-solid, dispose of with regular trash.
- 6) EMPTY PAINT CANS AND CONTAINERS ARE NOT RECYCLABLE
  - a. Remove lid and discard container in your regular trash.

Oil-based paints are accepted at the <u>Branson Household Chemical Collections Center</u> for Taney County residents.

Please do not dispose of paints by dumping them on the ground, into a storm drain, or down a household drain. Improperly dumping paints or solvents can allow them to move into the groundwater or surface waterways.
